We continue to search for new job training opportunities for the individuals we serve here, so if you know of any opportunities that will benefit our individuals, please contact us at (478) 929-6600.

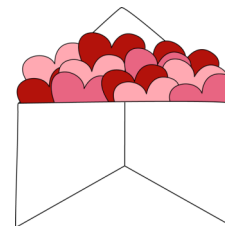

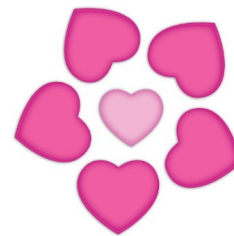

As you may know, we serve Peach, Bibb, and Houston County, and putting together routes with reasonable times on the bus for each individual, as well as getting people to the Center and home again at reasonable hours of the day with some of the far flung residences is a challenge. We are working to serve the best we can for all individuals.

I was shocked and saddened, as were we all, at the sudden passing of our Executive Director, and my friend, Tod. Our prayers are with his family. The Board took quick action to appoint Letitia Peebles interim Director. She is doing a fine job, as expected. We are moving forward in all areas of Happy Hour and Falcon Park services.

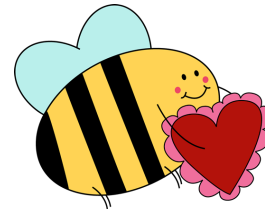
Our individuals enjoyed the GA National Fair as usual a few favorites were T-shirts, candy apples, and turkey legs.
